Andrea Pippen is a contemporary artist, graphic designer, illustrator, and author. Peppins created her first book, I Love My Hair, in part from a lack of stories celebrating women and girls of color. That lead Pippins to want to create a "tool for self-love, and a place where people could just create" which took the form of Peppin's Becoming Me, a journal and coloring book for self discovery. While some see her work as diverse, Pippin simply sees herself as drawing from her community and life experience as a black woman.

Her work can be found in media such as **The New York Times**, and **O: The Oprah Magazine**. Pippins's clients include **Broadly**, **ESPN**, **Lincoln Center**, and the **National Museum of African American History and Culture**.

Questions:
