Jean-Michel Basquiat 1960-1988

Jean-Michel Basquiat is a an African-American artist from the 1980s best known for expressive paintings with personal iconography rooted in graffitti and Abstract Expressionism. As Wikipedia describes, his work dwells on "dichotomies such as wealth versus poverty, integration versus segregation, and inner versus outer experience." He also tackled police brutality and racism in his paintings, which make it seems as relevant today as it was in 1982.

Even as Basquiat's career flourished and he socialized with other famous artists yet at the height of his career, he struggled to even hail a cab.
