
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Thanksgiving by Alice Neel

Alice Neel was an American painter best known for portraits of friends, family, lovers, poets, artists, and strangers. Her paintings display an expressionistic use of color and line that captures the inner character of her sitters. Helen Molesworth in a Getty Institute podcast stated, "Neel painted people as she saw them: asymmetrical, eccentric, and filled with life."

She lived and worked in obscurity for most of her life. With the rise in feminism, Neel gained recognition and eventually fame for her work.
