Yayoi Kusama is a Japanese contemporary artist best known for her sculpture and installations. Kusama's work also includes painting, performance, film, fashion, poetry, fiction, and more. She has been called "the princess of polka dots," because it is the common theme in her work. Her repetitive dots and marks allow her to feel as if everything is melting and melding into the bigger universe.

Kusuma was approached to create a float for the annual Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade. Her float, Love Flies Up to the Sky, is a character drawn from her most recent "My Eternal Soul" series of works.
